### MINUTES

- I. Kim Friedman gave an **introduction** of the budget process the board followed and Board approval on December 20, 2010, of a proposed FY12 \$1,995,170 budget. She also spoke about the success NewBrook Elementary is having during the first year of the merger of the Brookline and Newfane Schools.
- II. The school board asked for **suggestions** regarding getting budget information out to the public:
  - a. Provide the *Reformer* and the *Commons* with an article discussing the budget
  - b. Submit to the Garden Club email list
  - c. Post on sandwich boards in both towns
  - d. Submit to the Brookline town email list
  - e. Post on the school web page
  - f. Post at the fire department
  - g. Post at Grace Cottage
- III. **Questions regarding the budget**
  - a. What is the maintenance expense for the Brookline building? \$13,000
  - b. Did the school board consider the deisel surcharge?
  - c. What is the impact of the budget on education?
    - i. The school board is committed to offering more educational opportunities.
    - ii. There is an increase in Physical Education and Guidance Counseling Services.
    - iii. A hot lunch program has been started with \$2,500 grant from the state of Vermont, including a staff person to manage the program.
    - iv. The WCSU is streamlining the bus route.
    - v. Installation of a new boiler to reduce heating costs
    - vi. New technology equipment and implementation of "power school" software that permits communication between parents, teachers and students.

- IV. Discussion of **Australian Ballot** for the school budget vote
- a. The pros and cons of Australian ballot were outlined:
    - i. Australian ballot offers greater access to more people to cast a vote.
    - ii. Meeting vote allows discussion if the budget is defeated thereby giving the voters a voice in the resolution.
  - b. It was decided that the school board would research the legal ends of Australian ballot and possibly a hybrid voting system where voters could come together prior to the vote to give in-put and then cast votes by Australian ballot at another time.
